

Medication Reminders

Things to Remember for Your First Appointment

Certain medications can affect the results of your skin testing. Antihistamines, cold remedies, allergy medications, and certain stomach medications need to be stopped 72 hours prior to your appointment.

It is important that you continue to take *all* medications you are taking for asthma.

Wear short sleeves, and **DO NOT** wear lotions or powders on your upper arms the day of testing. Deodorants can be worn.

Please bring your completed health history form to your appointment if you did not complete online.

Allow at least 2 hours for your first appointment.

The following is a list of some common antihistamine products. If you are taking a medication that includes any of these ingredients, it must be stopped 72 hours prior to your appointment.

Please be aware that this is only a partial listing. Most "cold", "sinus" and "allergy" medications should be stopped 72 hours before your appointment.
